Communication about student learning...

At THJ, we recognize the importance of frequent, consistent, and specific communication with parents.

Daily folders are sent home in student backpacks. Information about classroom and school events will be included in the folders.

Parent-Teacher Conferences will take place mid-October.

Report cards are sent home at the end of each nine weeks. Progress Reports are sent home on the fifth week of each nine weeks.

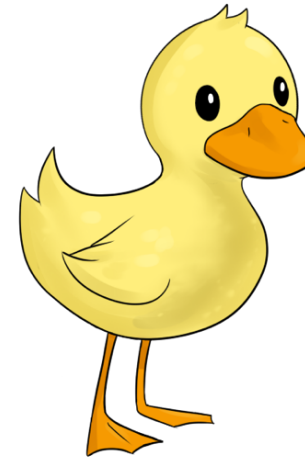
Teachers use a communication app called Class Dojo to send information to parents and keep them up to date with classroom news.

In the Classroom

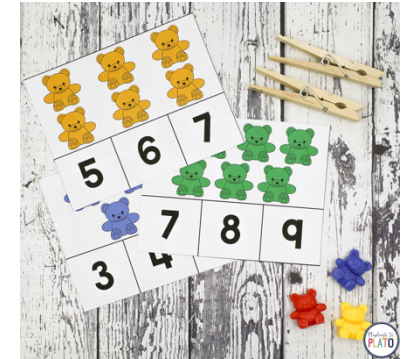
The teachers will work with students and their families to help students achieve success in reading and math.

Parents can support our initiatives at school by contributing at home in the following ways:

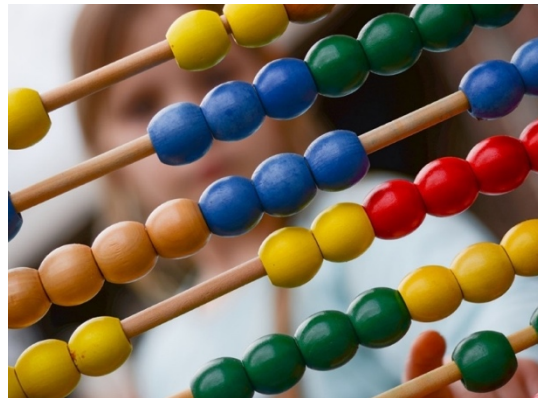
- Read a book with your child every day.

Our goal is for our students to exceed the minimum grade-level expectations in order to better prepare them for their future education.

1. Prepare students at all grade levels for success at the next grade level.
2. Kindergarten students will be able to read 100 high-frequency words by the end of the year.
3. Pre-K students will acquire pre-reading skills including identifying upper and lowercase letters and sounds, rhyming, blending, and segmenting.
4. Students will be able to read, write, and use numbers to count, add, subtract, and compare values.
5. All students will learn to communicate and work together to solve problems.
