- <u>GRADES MATTER.</u>

- HAVING ANY OFFER IS A BLESSING. EX: HS Football to NCAA FOOTBALL IS 5.7% HS Basketball to NCAA BASKETBALL IS 3.0%

- Division 1 Colleges- (347 schools)
- (D-1's can offer both academic & athletic scholarships. Scholarships can
- also be stacked)
- D-1 offers are <u>NOT</u> always committable.
- Example: University of Texas–NLY 25 athletes CAN COMMIT. Always ask if
- the offer is a committable offer.
- MUST HAVE <u>16 CORE CLASSES</u> TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR D1 -per NCAA.
- D-1 College Examples: University of Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Christian University, Stephen F. Austin

Division 2 Colleges- (312 schools)

D2's can offer both athletic & academic scholarships. Stacked scholarships are contingent on the school

DIVISION 3

 Division 3 Colleges- (442 schools) (D3's can't offer athletic scholarships. Only academic scholarships/grants)

• DON'T AUTOMATICALLY WRITE OFF DIII PROGRAMS BECAUSE THEY DON'T OFFER ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS. THEY CAN OFFER ENOUGH GRANTS AND NON-ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS THAT OFTEN MAKE THE COST OF ATTENDING LESS THAN A D1 OR D2.

- 40% of all NCAA athletes compete D3 (largest population division)
- 6 players in the 2023 MLB Draft
- D3 College Examples McMurry University, Howard Payne University, ETBU- East Texas Baptist University



• NAIA Colleges- <u>(250 schools)</u>

NAIA's can offer both athletic & academic scholarships.

NAIA scholarships can only be stacked contingent of the college. (Similar to D-2)

NAIA College Examples:

Texas Wesleyan University, Wayland Baptist University, SAGU (Southwestern Assemblies of God)

1,132 JUCO PROGRAMS (OFFER BOTH ATHLETIC & ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS)

• JUCO'S DO NOT HAVE THE SAME RULES AS NCAA. THEIR PRACTICE TIMES/GAME RESTRICTIONS AREN'T AS STRICT.

MOST OF THE TIME THE TOUGHEST KIDS IN COLLEGE ATHLETICS COME FROM JUCO

• JUCO COLLEGE EXAMPLES: BLINN COLLEGE, CISCO COLLEGE, TYLER JUNIOR COLLEGE

<u>DO NOT</u> WRITE OFF A JUCO PROGRAM. JUCOS ARE USUALLY LOADED AND ARE A LANDING SPOT FOR MANY LEGIT D-1 PROSPECTS WHO DO NOT HAVE THE GRADES.

• Ultimately your recruiting process is in your hands.

• Be willing to do the hard part of recruiting-emails, messages, questionnaires, etc.

FINDING THE "FIT"- COLLEGE SEARCH

- Does this school offer my major?
- Search the college rosters. DO YOU LOOK LIKE THEM?
- Does this college fit my financial needs?
- Is this a place I want to live for the next 2-4 years?

<u>DO NOT</u> fall in love with a school strictly because of the coaching staff. It is great if you love the coaches, but loving the school is important also.

COLLEGE CAMPS/SHOWCASES

- •COLLEGES WANT TO FIND OUT WHO CAN'T PLAY AT CAMPS, THEY ALREADY KNOW WHO CAN. •BE REALISTIC.
- •ALWAYS HAVE A COPY OF YOUR TRANSCRIPTS/TEST SCORES WITH YOU.
- •ATTEND CAMPS, BUT DON'T OVER DO IT.
- •CALL/EMAIL COLLEGES AND LET THEM KNOW YOU ARE COMING.
- •BE SURE TO SEND FILM BEFORE YOU GO.
- •LET YOUR HS COACH KNOW YOU'RE GOING

HOW TO TALK TO COLLEGE RECRUITERS

MISS SCHOOL= MISS AN OPPORTUNITY

- Firm Handshake
- Dress appropriate
- Be prepared to give the coaches your current height and weight.
- Be prepared to give them your strengths and weakness to your game.
- Know your STATS, GPA, and Test Scores
- Study the schools you are interested in so you can drop some information on

them. It will impress them.

HELPFUL COMMENTS "Coach, I love the weight room." "I had great stats, but most importantly I'm hungry to win."

BE PREPARED TO HEAR "NO."

"No" from a school doesn't mean you aren't good enough to play at the next level.

"No" doesn't mean give up.

"No" means you aren't a fit for THAT school. That doesn't mean you aren't a fit for other schools.

DON'T STRESS THE STARS STARS OR RANKINGS AREN'T A MAKE OR BREAK FOR ANY SPORT.

• ARTICLES AREN'T GOING TO GET YOU A SCHOLARSHIP.

• <u>BE PROUD OF THOSE THINGS, BUT THEY WON'T MAKE OR</u> <u>BREAK YOU...SO DON'T LET THEM GET YOU DISCOURAGED.</u>



- Coaches are watching Social Media.
- Don't take money to participate in any sports.
- Understand the total amount of scholarships given by each sport.
- Find a place you will feel the most comfortable regardless of size.
- Be Realistic!!!

TRANSFER PORTAL

GO WHERE YOU ARE <u>CELEBRATED</u> NOT <u>TOLERATED</u>.

• 17% of athletes that enter the transfer portal successfully find "NEW" homes.

• Know when you're a priority for a school.

• DO NOT get lost in the hype over logos.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

YOU CAN TAKE AN UNLIMITED AMOUNT. THEY CAN OCCUR ANYTIME EXCEPT FOR DEAD PERIODS START

DURING YOUR FRESHMAN YEAR. NO TIME LIMIT OR LENGTH COLLEGES CAN'T PAY FOR LODGING, TRAVEL

OR MEALS.



A visit financed in whole or in part by an institution.

5 D1; unlimited Division II and III NAIA & JUCO

Colleges must have a transcript, test score and you must be <u>registered with the NCAA Eligibility Center.</u>

Can not exceed 48 hours.

CONTACT PERIODS

What is a contact?

A contact occurs any time a college coach says more than hello during a face-to-face contact with a college-bound student-athlete or his or her parents off the college's campus.

What is a contact period?

During a contact period a college coach may have face-to-face contact with college-bound student-athletes or their parents, watch student-athletes compete and visit their high schools, and write or telephone student-athletes or their parents.



What is a dead period?

During a dead period a college coach may not have face-to-face contact with college-bound student-athletes or their parents, and may not watch student-athletes compete or visit their high schools. Coaches may write and telephone student-athletes or their parents during a dead period.

What are recruiting calendars?

Recruiting calendars help promote the well-being prospective student-athletes and coaches and ensure competitive equity by defining certain time periods in which recruiting may or may not occur in a particular sport.

EVALUATION PERIOD

What is an evaluation period?

During an evaluation period a college coach may watch college-bound student-athletes compete, visit their high schools, and write or telephone student-athletes or their parents. However, a college coach may not have face-to-face contact with college-bound student-athletes or their parents off the college's campus during an evaluation period.



What is a quiet period?

During a quiet period, a college coach may only have face-to-face contact with college-bound student-athletes or their parents on the college's campus. A coach may not watch student-athletes compete (unless a competition occurs on the college's campus) or visit their high schools. Coaches may write or telephone college-bound student-athletes or their parents during this time.

ACT/SAT TEST

- In order to go D1, D2, D3, NAIA YOU MUST TAKE THE ACT/SAT
- If you qualify for free lunch you can receive a waiver to take each test for <u>free</u>twice.
- If an athlete receives Special Education accommodations in school, they can also get them for each test.
- You can't sign with a school from the divisions above if you haven't taken the test.
- Goal is to take the test your junior year.

- <u>D1 & D2-</u> work on the NCAA Sliding Scale (Athletes must test in either the ACT/SAT) *Most schools have higher academic requirements for admission*
- <u>NAIA-</u> The NCAA sliding scale doesn't apply but you still have to meet the schools academic requirements & test in either the ACT/SAT
- <u>D3-</u>There are no athletic scholarships. GRADES ARE A MUST.
- <u>JUCO-</u> Must have a High School diploma. SAT/ACT are not required.

Registration Checklist

TAKE YOUR FIRST STEP TO BECOMING AN NCAA STUDENT-ATHLETE

If you want to play NCAA sports at a Division I or II school, you must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org. Plan to register during your freshman year of high school.



A high-school athlete who is classified as an NCAA Non-Qualifier:

• Cannot receive an athletic scholarship during their freshman year unless the requirements for "Academic Redshirt" are met.

- Will NOT be eligible to compete with the team during their freshman year.
- Will not be eligible to practice with the team or attend weight training with their team.

JUCO NCAA NON-QUALIFIER

High-school athletes who go to a JUCO their freshman year as an NCAA Non-Qualifier:

• Will NOT be eligible to transfer to a Division I program after just one year.

• Will have more extensive academic requirements at the JUCO to be immediately eligible upon transfer to a Division I program (more required junior college courses).

NLI- NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

• THERE IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN <u>SIGNING & VERBALLY COMMITTING.</u>

• PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS AGREE TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL AID FOR ONE ACADEMIC YEAR TO THE STUDENT-ATHLETE AS LONG AS THE STUDENT-ATHLETE IS ADMITTED TO THE SCHOOL AND IS ELIGIBLE FOR FINANCIAL AID UNDER NCAA RULES. OTHER FORMS OF FINANCIAL AID DO NOT GUARANTEE THE STUDENT-ATHLETE FINANCIAL AID.

• SIGNING AN NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT ENDS THE RECRUITING PROCESS SINCE PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS ARE PROHIBITED FROM RECRUITING STUDENT-ATHLETES WHO HAVE ALREADY SIGNED LETTERS WITH OTHER PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS.

• A STUDENT-ATHLETE WHO HAS SIGNED A NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT MAY REQUEST A RELEASE FROM HIS OR HER CONTRACT WITH THE SCHOOL, IF A STUDENT-ATHLETE SIGNS A NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT WITH ONE SCHOOL BUT ATTENDS A DIFFERENT SCHOOL, HE OR SHE WILL LOSE ONE FULL YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY AND MUST COMPLETE A FULL ACADEMIC YEAR AT THEIR NEW SCHOOL BEFORE BEING ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE.
