



Taylor ISD's total tax rate for the 2022 tax year, is \$1.28 per \$100 of assessed valuation (\$0.94 M&O + \$0.34 I&S) and represents the lowest district tax rate since 2008.




A school bond is like a mortgage and the I&S tax revenue pays off that mortgage over time.











65+ RESIDENTS ANYONE OVER THE AGE OF 65 WHO HAVE FILED A HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION WILL NOT BE IMPACTED BY CITY AND COUNTY TAXES. THE 2022 SCHOOL BOND WILL NOT IMPACT ANYONE OVER OR UNDER 65.

- 2019 House Bill 3 Texas Education Code, all ISD bond propositions must include the following statement on the ballot: "THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE".

IN OTHER WORDS

Due to this requirement all voters will see this statement in the official ballot language even if there is no tax rate increase. Taxes are impacted because the current rate is paying off the debt, but the rate is not going up.

PROPOSITION A

"THE ISSUANCE OF AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$82,470,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, ACQUISITION, EQUIPMENT, AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT, THE PURCHASE OF THE NECESSARY SITES FOR **SCHOOL** BUILDINGS, AND THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES AND THE LEVYING AND IMPOSITION OF TAXES SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. IS A THIS PROPERTY TAX INCREASE."




